<u>T'filah, or Amidah – "Prayer", or "Standing"</u>

Please rise

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Adonai, s'fatai tiftach ufi yagid t'hilatecha

Eternal G-d, open my lips that my mouth may declare your glory. (2x)

Avot v'Imahot -- Recalling our ancestors

Who brought you to this moment? Who has helped you become yourself? Who started your feet on the Jewish path?

Gevurot -- G-d's power

What natural event moves you? Where do you find the breath of the Eternal? How does it feel to be smaller than the Universe?

Kedushat ha-Shem – G-d's Holiness

What keeps your world together? You're G-d. What makes you so special? Where does G-d end, and the world begin?

V'Shamru -- The covenant of Shabbat

Why do you look forward to Shabbat? What does "complete rest" mean to you?

Birkat Shalom – Blessing for Peace

What does "peace" mean to you? "Shalom" also means "wholeness." How is this a part of your life?

Hoda'a -- Giving thanks

What gifts have you received this week? This month? This year? How are you grateful to others? How are others grateful to you?

(If you wish, continue with personal prayer, and sit when you are done)

Oseh Shalom – Bestow Peace

Oseh shalom bim'romav, hu ya'aseh shalom aleinu v'al kol yisrael, v'imru amein. May the One who causes peace to reign in the high heavens send to peace to us and all Israel as we say: Amen.
